



# Conditions of Entry

## Conditions of Entry to Adamsfield Conservation Area and Florentine River Regional Reserve

Authorities to enter the above-mentioned areas are issued to the named person for the vehicle listed on the application form in accordance with Regulation 28 of the *National Parks and Reserves Management Regulations 2019* to undertake activities, subject to the conditions listed below, that would otherwise be prohibited under Regulations 5(2)(a), 5(2)(c), 5(12)(a), 5(12)(b), 19(6) and 20(2).

Approval is given to drive a vehicle on a closed road within the Adamsfield Conservation Area and Florentine River Regional Reserve. Approval is also given to possess and carry a chainsaw for the purpose of clearing vegetation that may prevent the safe passage on the tracks and routes identified on the map provided.

The collection of firewood in the Adamsfield Conservation Area and Florentine River Regional Reserve is an offence.

This authority is only issued in the event that your online enquiry is approved. An authority form must be collected from the Mount Field National Park Visitor Centre before visiting the above-mentioned locations.

Authorities are only valid for the duration of your visit and are recorded on your authority form. Entry into these locations without a valid authority is an offence.

All motorised vehicles (including 4-wheel and 2-wheel motorbikes) must be appropriately registered and drivers must have the appropriate license to operate them.

### CONDITIONS

1. Authority must be carried at all times when accessing the Adamsfield Conservation Area and Florentine River Regional Reserve in a vehicle and must be produced on demand of an Authorised Officer.
2. Prior to entering all vehicles accessing the Adamsfield Conservation Area and the Florentine River Regional Reserve must be clean and free

from mud to prevent the spread of weeds and fungal diseases.

3. The Authority permits entry via Morley Track or Sawback Range Track and only applies to the authorised use of tracks identified on the map attached to the authority. Driving or riding on tracks other than those on the attached map is prohibited.
4. The Sawback Range Track is to be traversed from entry at Frodsham's Pass on the Gordon River Road and exit via the Clear Hill Road only.
5. Chainsaws may only be used for the purpose of clearing vegetation that may prevent the safe passage on the tracks and routes identified on the attached map. No standing trees are to be felled nor any materials are to be removed. Campers must bring their own firewood.

### Keys and Gates

6. The numbered key issued with the Authority is non-transferable. It is not to be duplicated and must be returned to the Mount Field Parks and Wildlife Service office by the date specified on the authority.
7. All locked gates or barriers must be closed and locked immediately upon entry or exit.
8. The key issued is subject to the deposit of \$300.00. Failure to return the issued key by the date specified will result in the forfeiture of the deposit.
9. Persons undertaking activities under the Authority must exercise due caution, care, and respect for other users of the reserved land to ensure that other users are not displaced or have their experience diminished through the exercise of the authority.

### INFORMATION FOR DRIVERS

- The vehicle driven must have current registration or have Conditional ("RV") registration (with a certificate of Approved Operation allowing recreational use). All applicable conditions within the *Vehicle and Traffic (Driver Licensing and Vehicle Registration) Regulations 2021* must be complied with.



- The rider/driver must hold a current drivers' licence for the class of vehicle being used.
- Tracks have bogs and ruts. These tracks should not be attempted unless: your vehicle is well equipped; you are familiar with how to drive through deep water; and you are aware of the risks it poses to your vehicle.
- Clear Hill Road is a Sustainable Timbers Tasmania Road and log trucks and machinery may be encountered. The road is not always maintained and may be slippery, have large potholes or trees across it.

#### RESPECTING AND PROTECTING

- The Adamsfield Conservation Area and Florentine River Regional Reserve is a Fuel Stove Only area. Fire is only allowed in the designated fire pit at the Village Green. Fire is prohibited in the event fire bans and/or restrictions are in place.
- Existing campsites should be used where possible. The shelter on the Village Green is a public and shared space. It is not to be used as overnight accommodation.
- Rubbish must not be left behind.
- Toilets are not provided. Bury all faecal waste and toilet paper in holes 15-20cm deep at least 100m from water, camps, and tracks.
- Respect nature and abide by the National Four-Wheel Drive Code of Ethics and Leave No Trace Principals. Further information on these ethics and principals can be found on the Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Website.
